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#### Introduction

As the basic unit for achieving holistic national development, the National Development Planning Commission at every plan year releases guidelines for preparing Medium-Term Development Plans for all metropolitan, Municipal, and District Assemblies (MMDAs) nationwide. This is to ensure uniformity and harmony in the implementation of national policy. By this, MMDAs are mandated by *National Development Planning (System) Regulations* 2016, LI 2232 and Section 83 (1a) Act 936 Local Governance Act, 2016, further states that "A District Planning Authority shall initiate and prepare district development plans and settlement structure plans in the manner prescribed by the Commission and (1b) ensure that the district Development Plans and Settlement structure plans are prepared with the full participation of the local community"

In fulfillment of this mandate, Bosomtwe District has prepared her 'working document' (Medium Term Development Plan-2022-2025) based on the NDPC guidelines.

The 2025 Composite Annual Action Plan (CAAP) being the fourth-year plan for this plan period, has a proposed ninety-three (89) programs and projects for implementation. The total budgeted cost for the implementation of these projects and programmes in the district stands at **Thirteen million, eight hundred and forty-five thousand six hundred and ninety-two Ghana Cedis, twenty-eight pesewas (GhC13,845,692.28).** These projects and programmes are mainly made up of routine administrative programmes, completed, and ongoing projects that have been rolled over for the 2025 fiscal year. The plan will be financed by the DACF, DACF-RFG, IGF, Donors, and other GoG funding sources.

The 2025 CAAP is prepared around five Programmes (PBB) with their respective sub-programmes: Management and Administration, Infrastructure Delivery and Management, Social Service Delivery, Economic Development, and Environmental and Sanitation Management.

#### Vision

The Assembly's vision is to become "the most vibrant District Assembly in Ghana implementing government's development agenda in a transparent and accountable manner"

#### Mission

The Bosomtwe District Assembly exists to execute sustainable development programmes in all sectors of the economy through active citizen participation and accelerated service delivery in accordance with sound environmental principles to improve the quality of life of its people.

#### **Key Functions**

The BDA performs a number of co-ordinated statutorily defined functions derived from Section 245 of the 1992 Constitution of the Republic of Ghana as well as Section 10 (3) of the Local Government Act, 2016 (Act 936). Broadly, these functions which are deliberative, legislative and executive in nature, include but not limited to the following.

- Responsible for the overall development of the district
- Preparation of development plans and budget
- Formulate and execute plans, programmes and strategies for the effective mobilization of resources necessary for the overall development of the district;
- Promote and support productive activity and social development in the district;
- Initiate programmes for the development of basic infrastructure
- Provide municipal works and service in the district;
- Be responsible for the development, improvement and management of human settlements and the environment in the district;
- In co-operation with appropriate national and local security agencies, be responsible for the maintenance of security and public safety in the district;
- Perform such other functions as may be provided under any other enactment.
